

June 22, 2022

The Newton Advisory Board of Health held a regular meeting on the above date at 7:00 p.m. Present were Dr. Nancy Craddock, Dr. John Craddock, Mr. William Hagaman and Mrs. Teresa A. Oswin, BOH Secretary. Dr. Beatriz Bueno was absent. Maria Cuevas-Greco, Health Inspector from the Sussex County Board of Health was also present.

Mrs. Oswin made the following declaration that "in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act, notice of this regular meeting was given to the two newspapers of record and posted on the official bulletin board on January 3, 2022."

Upon motion of Dr. J. Craddock, seconded by Mr. Hagaman and carried, the minutes of September 22, 2021 Regular meeting were unanimously approved.

There was no Unfinished Business to discuss.

Under New Business, Ms. Cuevas-Greco reviewed the routine health notices submitted by the Sussex County Health Department. Dr. Nancy Craddock asked several questions on different violations and all questions were addressed. Ms. Cuevas-Greco explained the difference between critical and non-critical violations.

Dr. Craddock questioned on the Water Quality Report and asked if the Town was aware the lawsuit filed against Middlesex County regarding their water quality. Mrs. Oswin said she would speak to the engineers about it and see if there is any concern for Newton.

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Mrs. Oswin reviewed the recent resolutions adopted by the Newton Town Council. Newton Auto Salvage and George's Salvage were both approved for 2022 as Junk Dealers. Mrs. Oswin then explained the Town of Newton use to use a shared service to provide us with Animal Control. Wantage had some personnel issues last year and could no longer provide services. Ms. Jessica Vollero comes highly recommended, and she started February 1<sup>st</sup>. We ordered an animal control van, and it is expected to arrive in August. Another municipality has approached Newton about doing a shared service to provide Animal Control Services. We are looking into it. A brief discussion took place on licensing of dogs and cats in Town.

Mrs. Oswin advised she has a conflict on the next meeting date and asked if the Board would be willing to meet another date. After a brief discussion, September 21<sup>st</sup> was offered as an alternate date. Dr. Nancy Craddock asked if everyone would be agreeable to changing the meeting time to 6:00pm. There were no objections. Mrs. Oswin will speak to Dr. Bueno to find out if she has a conflict with the time.

Dr. Nancy Craddock opened the meeting to the public.

There being no one from the public to be heard, upon motion of Mr. Hagaman seconded by Dr. J Craddock and carried, the meeting adjourned at 7:36 p.m.
